PROJECT DESCRIPTION (10 Points) Draw a plan of your project area showing size. Include the crop(s) grown, varieties, acreage, planting dates, seeding rate/spacing. (200 words)				
PROJECT COSTS (20 Points) List all items of cost in detail for producing and marketing of crops included in your project. Where no actual outlay of money was involved, estimate the cost and mark it "est". Local rates for custom work minus the operator's wages should be used in estimating field costs. Include the rent of land (usually figured at 7% of the cash value of bare land).				
PRODUCTION PRACTICES (20 Points) Include such items such as soil testing, mulches, fertilizers, irrigation, pests (insects, diseases, weeds, etc.) and their control. List methods, dates and amounts. (500 words)				
PROJECT INCOME (20 Points) Indicate the name and address of the company that purchased your product. List the number of acres in production, total yield, yield per acre, total receipts and costs, receipts and costs per acre, total profit or loss and profit or loss per acre. Include any other pertinent information such as produce grades and whether the crops included in your project are all that is grown of that particular crop. (300 words)				
ANALYSIS OF PROJECT (20 Points) Describe how you would improve your project if you were to repeat it and list things you have learned. Include details on varieties, pruning, spraying and other production practices for your specific crop. Were the initial goals reached? What was the return per hour of time invested? Were dividends in the form of money, satisfaction or any other way worth the time and effort? (300 words)				
SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT (10 Points) Information not included in other parts may be included here. This should be a picture and word essay of your project. Newspaper clippings may be included if they relate directly to your project. Photographs with brief captions should show progress over the entire course of production and selling crop. (Up to 10 photographs and 400 words)
